Take care around animals on country roads

Animal collisions can pose a big risk on country roads, especially at dusk and dawn. Wildlife, such as kangaroos, as well as livestock, can be fast and unpredictable. When they stray onto the road, it's hard to know what they'll do next. Slowing down and staying alert can help keep everyone safe.



Tips for staying safe

Reduce speed

Slow down and look out for wildlife on or near the roadside.

Brake safely

Apply your brakes in a careful, controlled manner. Leave space and pass with care when it is safe to do so.

Don't swerve

Take great care if you manoeuvre to avoid an animal. You may lose control of your vehicle if you swerve too harshly.
